Thanks to the club's roofing crew, we now have a sound, painted roof that should last another ten years. Peter Hockley led the removal of four runs of rusted iron and replacing with new; the whole roof (moss-sprayed back in April) was then water blasted and painted.

Since this work will never be seen by most members, a few facts:

- 118 volunteer man-hours
- 32 metres of new iron
- 57 litres of paint
- 7 trashed pairs of shoes and jeans
- \$2,000 total cost; \$10,000 – \$20,000 saved
